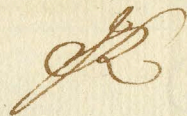

Leitch 17th August 1824

I take the liberty of addressing you on a subject which will come fresh to your memory when you will peruse this - being now a man of family I will be as delicate in that point as possible, leaving the matter for yourself to judge whether this communication be correct or not

no doubt you recollect Miss Bingham who was under your protection some time before you left Cornwall U, Canada, and on getting the road for France you addressed a letter to her Father Mr Bingham, a copy of which letter are annexed to the Reverend J. Sumner's certificate of the Child's Baptism on the twenty second day of May 1816 at Montreal in the Province of Lower Canada. Extracted from the register of the Scotch Church on the 25 Octr 1816

The truth is that this unfortunate woman was delivered of a Male Child on the 13 August 1815, her parents refusing her any shelter after you left the Country, she was thrown on the mercy of those who are willing to protect the unfortunate - herself being probably rather extravagant the means left at her disposal (tho handsome) did not last long - after she was delivered she went to Montreal with the Child and put up at a Mr Simon Prasse's

Inn keeper where she remained about seven months, the child
was not yet Baptized, Mr Fraser was getting tired of her she and
the child was getting destitute of clothing or, I found out the history
of the woman and child I made it a point of duty to call and see her
I found that she was rather deranged, I went and bought something for
the boy and got him doped, as a child ought to be, I then went to Mr Summ-
-rell the minister of montreal brought him with me to Mr Frasers Inn
Got fus more with me and Baptized the child, called him Hector
I took the vows upon myself which a father does according to the rites
of the Church of Scotland, I then sent her from Montreal in the stage
with a letter to her father requesting him to take her under his protection
untill he heard from you, she went no further up than Lachine, there
she remained till what little she got at montreal was expended. she
soon returned to montreal, where she was wandering to and fro - during
the time she was at Lachine I and my family left montreal for upper
Canada - thinking that she was at her fathers, I heard soon after I came
to upper Canada that she did not come to her father - being anxious about the
child I made some further enquiry for her, and learned that she returned
to town where she and the child were suffering, untill a Mr William
Lans a native of Glasgow took the boy from her much against her will
~~where~~ she was taken in custody and ^{is} kept where she can do no harm
the boy is a promising boy -

and much to Mr Langs credit is taken care of the very same
as his own son who is about the same age — no doubt but he
had a good deal of trouble in bringing little Hector ^{up} his own wife
died when the two boys were infants — should it be convenient
for you to make him some remittance even according to the
sum mentioned in your letter to Mr Bingham I make no doubt
but what it will be very acceptable, tho by no means in want

The Honorable Wm Mc Gillvray a gentleman well known
to you is well ~~well~~ acquainted with Mr Lang and I am sure
will attend to any direction you may be pleased to give respect
Hector — I should be glad to hear what is to be of
him I make no doubt after those certificates are received
he will be taken under your own charge —
