Great news arrived from—(Shall we mention where?)

Well, not from Italy, nor Amsterdam,

But *fresh imported* from the *upper air*.

It came expressly for the Boys' ADDRESS,

And 'tho *expressly*, yet not by EXPRESS.

At twelve last night, just as the clocks all told it,

The *spark electric* flash'd down from on high;

Proclaiming, "EIGHTEEN SIXTY" in a cold fit,

Had yielded up his last ghost of a sigh:—

That old DAME NATURE had brought forth a Son,

Whom "*wet nurse*" EARTH named EIGHTEEN SIXTY-ONE.

The telegram—(the operator TIME,)

Gave also these particulars additional:—

"The FATES, those up-stairs Ministers sublime,

According to their wont—old and traditional—

Were at the birth, and made a jolly din,

Just when the CHILD by TIME was ushered in."
