A Society That Encompasses Art, Music, Painting, Literature

Montreal changes. Things come and go. But not all, and for a reason. Because it serves a definite need in society, the Women's Art Society, l'Association Culturelle des Femmes de Montreal, is still active and on-going.

Eighty-seven years ago The Women's Art Society began in Miss Phillips' Studio, with twenty-one ladies. While still adhering to the original concept — "The object of this organization shall be the promotion of a more general interest, and the encouragement of a higher standard of workmanship in all branches of Art" — it has evolved.

Through the years the Society has been affiliated with the National Council of Women of Canada, and is the parent organization of the Women's Branch of the Antiquarian and Numismatic Society and the Canadian Handicrafts Guild.

Under the presidency of Mrs. Lea Simard, the three hundred or more members follow their preference and increase their knowledge in three main categories: art and music, painting, and literature.

Weekly meetings are held at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts. The literature group meets in members' homes, each person doing about three original works during the year. Reading of these creative writings sometimes provides the program for Members' Day meetings.





The Greek tree is hung with tiny kilted evzones, circles of bread and bright red candied apples, that of the American Women's Club with heartshaped cookies, colored paper cutouts and candles. Replicas of the blue and yellow Swedish flag and tiny figures of Santa Claus cover Sweden's tree. The Hungarian tree will delight children with its red and green ribbon bows (the Hungarian colors), pine cones, candy canes and gilded walnuts.

Those who decorated the Colombian tree used imaginative planning to cover it with miniature packets of coffee, a product for which the country is noted.



Women's Art Society rich source of culture

Ninety years ago this coming spring an event will occur of interest to historians and artists alike.

A Montreal art society (later to become the Women's Art Society of Montreal) was inaugurated into the Women's Art Association of Canada. It is the second longest surviving group of its kind this city has known.

The Society's development was rapid; by 1900 they were exhibiting crafts from the outlying areas of Montreal at the Morgan Art Gallery, an event which attracted 8,000 people.

At the time the new Antiquarian Society was interested in having a Ladies' Branch and subsequently the members of the Women's Art Society took that under their wing as well, forming the Women's Branch of what is today the Antiquarian and Numismatic Society.

Several members of the Society (membership totals approximately 300) live on the West Island and the North Shore. Mary Clamen of Dorval has been a member for five years and is the press secretary of the group.

A former teacher with the Protestant School Board of Montreal, Clamen has introduced many local residents with an interest in the arts to the Society.

"I feel it is a rich source of culture," says Clamen.
"It also offers companionship and participation through its varied programs, which include literary discussion, annual exhibitions, concert recitals, talks on architecture, on drama ..."

Also, every year the Society invites a McGill music student to give a recital; Maureen Forrester gave one of her earliest performances for the group.
